Below are seven educational domains and defining observable behaviors. Use this tool to assess <u>preceptor</u> <u>behaviors</u> for an entire teaching session (e.g., half day of precepting). These behaviors lead to higher quality teaching and improved educational outcomes. For the teaching session, document the training level of the residents precepted and how many total precepting encounters occurred. Also, tally if the preceptor engaged in the behavior defined. At the end of the session, review which behaviors were and were not present, and identify opportunities for underutilized behaviors.
