and what if he got charged with a crime? would he *actually* do time? or would I just be wasting mine...

and what if you judged me, or shamed me? or, even worse, blamed me...

and most of all, apart from the shame and the blame, would you ever look at me the same?

Doc, I wanted to tell you everything but I needed you to take the first step, because all I could focus on was taking my next breath.
